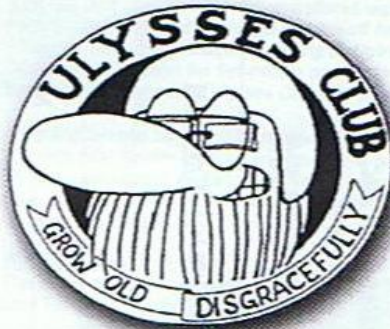

Australia's Biggest Morning Tea – Currimundi Lake Villas

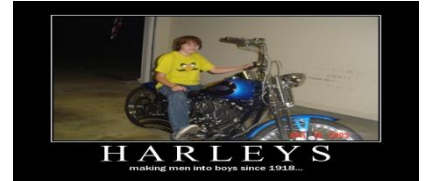
Currimundi Lakes Villas, biggest morning tea, was a great morning.

Letter to the Editor - from a wayward Ulyssian!

Hi y'all,

It's been five months since I last saw many of you and four months since the three thousand plus stalwarts had a riotous time at the AGM in Albany! Although I have been in contact with some of you since then, by phone or email, I'd like to bring you up to date with my adventures since I left the Sunshine Coast.

Let me start with the journey over to WA. I sailed along merrily on my own for the first week, occasionally meeting up with other Ulyssians at rest areas or campsites. It was only after I'd left Kimba, on my way to Ceduna, that my alternator decided it didn't want to play anymore but thankfully, others passing came to my aid and, with a bit of playing around with the electrics, got me going and escorted me to Ceduna. (Thanks guys).

I got some help and advice from local auto electricians and, a little apprehensively, (but knowing that Laurie and Marilyn were only a day behind me) I carried on, using one at a time of two fully charged batteries and the lighting fuses removed.

I met up with the Sunshine Coast 'Wing Recovery Unit (Laurie and Marilyn, Frank and Di) at Eucla and felt much more comfortable, though I had to have 240v at every evening camp to recharge both batteries. There were no further problems - not even rain - for the remainder of the trip and we arrived in Albany on time.

To summarise my AGM; not having wheels, I did a lot of exploring of the town on foot, meanwhile obtaining lots of help, knowledge and advice from many people, sourcing and fitting the replacement part. My sick bike was eventually cured five days later, in time for the Grand Parade. Despite being a pedestrian for much of the time, I thoroughly enjoyed the week at Albany.

After the farewells, I set off on my own Odyssey, though I very quickly discovered there were many other Ulyssians who didn't want to go home just yet! I made lasting friendships with several Ulyssians (and other travellers) and, over the next three months, we all stayed in touch and often camped together in various places. I have explored much of the Southwest and Great Southern, delighting in the excellent, sweeping, quiet roads, the beautiful scenery and the extremely friendly 'natives.'

Meanwhile, winter had come to this part of the State. Almost everyone I'd met had headed north for the warmer weather but I was still camping out. Daytime winter temperatures in the south of WA rarely reach the high 'teens and, at night, I've taken ice out of my wash up bowl that hasn't melted until 10.30am! I was never too concerned; I was warm at night, cooking and gossiping around the campfire then later, snug inside my sleeping bag.

On the 12th of June, I 'retired' from campsites and moved into a pre-arranged house sit (or perhaps farm sit would be more accurate?) at Redmond, a rural district about 30 klms NW of Albany. After four enjoyable months of outdoor living, I'm now indoors - and it's great! The farm covers some 360 acres with about two thirds set to bluegum plantation. On the remainder are the usual farm buildings, paddocks with 3 horses, about 30 cattle and 60 sheep, kennels (just one dog, "Bristle" now), chook pen, veggie garden and many fruit trees. Heating in the house is by a wood burning stove in the lounge and there is a wood burning heater to light up for hot water. Daily wood chopping and dog walks are keeping me healthier than I've been for ages!

Though I have minimal mobile phone coverage here and there is no internet coverage, with forethought, I can still do all the calling and connecting I want while I'm getting basic supplies in Albany, once or twice a week.

I'm staying at the farm in Redmond until early September. I'll be cruising back over to the Sunshine Coast after that, staying there during October and, all being well, I'm planning on heading south to Tasmania for a few months before once again returning to the mainland for the Newcastle AGM!

I will endeavour to get to see you all in October at one or more SSC functions. '

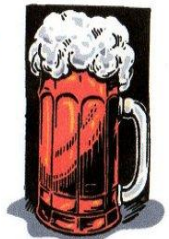

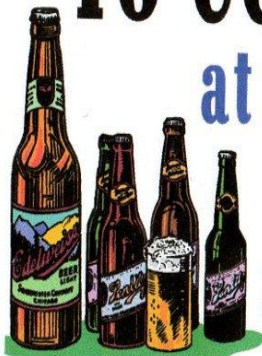

QLD survey of "older riders" but all welcome

The QLD Department of Transport & Main Roads (TMR) is conducting various research projects. One is looking at "Older Riders" and is based on a survey to provide the data. The survey was expected to be mailed out to a sample of Qld riders from about 10 May. The survey has a little over 100 multiple choice questions with an opportunity to also add comment. QLD TMR has cross-referenced their registration and licence databases to identify "active" riders. There are about 600,000 motorcycle licences held in QLD and about 170,000 QLD registered motorcycles. The initial random sample chosen for the survey will involve 6,000 "active" (licensed) QLD riders with current motorcycle registrations. Soon after the mail-out to the 6,000 (say about late May or early June?), I understand that the same survey will be accessible on-line. [B]Riders Australia-wide will then apparently be welcome to complete the survey[/B]. The Specific deliverables of this research project are are to:

1. What are the specific contributing factors to crashes for the identified high-risk age group(s)? That is, what factors contribute to making a particular group a high-risk group (e.g. motorcycle type, returning to riding after an extended break, risk
2. Quantify and describe the distribution of crashes relative to age in order to verify the perceived increased number of crashes seen in the 30-39 year older rider cohort; and, If it is established that the crash involvement pattern for a particular age group (for example, 30-39yrs) is significantly higher than for other age groups, identify specific associated (causal) factors contributing to these crashes including (but not limited to):
 - Identify if increased crash rate for a particular age-group(s) is associated with the specific generational characteristics of this cohort and therefore is likely to remain with this group as it ages.
 - What are the specific contributing factors to crashes for the identified high-risk age group(s)? That is, what factors contribute to making a particular group a high-risk group (e.g. motorcycle type, returning to riding after an extended break, risk taking, and so on)?

A consultancy (ARTD) is undertaking the survey and initial analysis. Riders have contributed to improvements to the survey (including Ulysses reps and others involved nationally and in Qld in safety).

I recommend that anyone provided the opportunity to complete it, does so (regardless of your age).
